

# Origin Story — When Our Story with God Begins

## DAY 1

### Read Psalm 19:1.

*“The heavens tell about the glory of God. The skies show that his hands created them” (NIRV).*

The heavens TELL.

The skies SHOW.

They’re all made by GOD’S HANDS.

You can just walk outside and see and know that God is real. Look up. Look around you. What do you see that God made? Everything.

## DAY 2

### Read Psalm 119:68.

*“You are good, and what you do is good. Teach me your orders” (NIRV).*

God is good. Sure, lots of things are good. Ice cream is good. Having fun with your friends is good. But God IS good. It’s who He is. He can’t be any different. No matter what, God is good.

The writer of Psalm 119 said that God is good, and what He does is good.

Do you think the person who wrote this never had anything bad happen? No way. No one has a life like that. We all experience things that are not great, big or small.

But the writer still said that God is good. God is still good even when we don’t understand why certain things happen. And when amazing things happen, God is still good.

Nahum 1:7 says the Lord is good. When people are in trouble, they can go to Him for safety. You can know without a doubt that God is always good. He doesn’t change.

### DAY 3

#### Read Hebrews 4:16.

*“So let us boldly approach God’s throne of grace. Then we will receive mercy. We will find grace to help us when we need it” (NIrV).*

When Adam and Eve sinned, a whole bunch of really sad stuff happened. Sin didn’t just hurt their hearts—it also hurt the world! The curse of sin brought pain, sickness, sadness, and even death. That was never God’s plan.

God had tried to protect Adam and Eve from all of this, but now He told them how much harder their lives would be. Even though God still loved them, He knew they couldn’t stay in the garden any longer. He made them clothes to wear from animal skins, then banished them from the garden.

He didn’t want to risk them coming into the garden, eating from the tree of life, and living forever in their cursed state. God didn’t want them to live forever apart from Him. The Bible says He placed angels and a flaming sword at the entrance to guard the way to the tree of life.

### DAY 4

#### Read Romans 5:8.

No one is perfect, and we all mess up. Even the people you think do everything right don’t do everything right all the time.

Here’s the amazing thing. God showed His love for us. While we were still sinners Jesus died for us. Not when we were perfect, Jesus loves us so much!

He wants us to come to Him when we’re making good choices. And He wants us to come to Him when we make choices that aren’t so good.
